	Class Name	Duration	Study Plan	Course Descriptions
1st Semester	Beginner-A	3 Months	The Letters A–Z, The Numbers 0–20, Vocabulary for Newcomers, understanding of Weather. End of level assessment and quiz.	Basic conversations in daily life, introduction to English grammar, and practice reading skills. At the end of this semester, students will be able to read, write the A-Z English alphabet, and numbers from 1-20. Students will also be able to introduce themselves. This level is ideal for those who have never spoken English before.
	Beginner-B	3 Months	Recap of Beginner A, Vowel and consonant letters, Numbers 21-100, reading Dates, Class conversations. End of Semester assessment and Test.	This level builds on Beginner A, introducing more complex vocabulary and structures. Students will practice reading dates and engage in basic class conversations. At the end of the semester, students will be assessed on their comprehension and usage of the material.
2nd Semester	Level1A	3 Months	Recap of Beginner B - To-Be verbs, Grammar, Vocabulary, Reading, Speaking, Spelling, and Conversation.	Level 1 helps students develop the foundations for the English language. At the end of this semester, students will be able to introduce themselves, talk about their home, city, and hobbies, expand their vocabulary, and understand basic grammar and punctuation. This semester is ideal for those who speak some English.
	Level1B	3 Months	Recap of Level 1A, Simple present tense, Traffic Signs, Parking, Shopping Malls, Calling, Doctor Appointments, School Emergency Handling, Listening.	This course expands on Level 1A, focusing on practical daily situations such as understanding traffic signs, parking, and handling emergencies. Students will also improve their listening skills and their ability to make simple sentences in the present tense.
3rd Semester	Level2A	3 Months	Recap of Level 1B, Simple past tense, Reading, Writing, Speaking, Career Choices, Education Goals, Email Setup.	This level introduces learners to the basics they'll need to communicate and function in English. Visually rich lessons are designed for middle literacy learners. By the end of this semester, students will improve their verbal and written communication to the next level. This course is ideal for intermediate students who have a job or are looking for a job.
	Level2B	3 Months	Recap of Level 2A, Future tense, Writing Topics, Speaking in Class for 3 Minutes, Building Skills, Explaining a Past Story, Filling in Grammar Blanks, Planning a Vacation.	Level 2B continues to build on previous knowledge, focusing on future tense and more complex writing topics. Students will practice speaking in class, building on their confidence and fluency. This course helps students plan and describe events in more detail.
4th Semester	Level3A	3 Months	Recap of Level 2B, Advanced Grammar, Reading, Topic Writing, Career Choices, Building Skills, Background, Education, and Basic Introduction to the Job Market and Researching.	This Level 3 intermediate guide introduces topics such as skills and tasks, giving instructions, and relationships and problem-solving. Audio material is provided at every stage to give vital experience in spoken English and make even tricky phrases easy to understand. By the end of this semester, students will be able to communicate easily and write long sentences without errors. This course is ideal for those who already speak, read, write, and communicate in English and want to polish their English to a more professional level.
	Level3B	3 Months	Recap of Level 3A, Speaking for 5 Minutes in Class, Writing a Past Story, Reading News, Articles, and Books, Understanding Listening Audio at 80%.	This level focuses on improving speaking and listening skills. Students will practice speaking for longer periods and understand more complex audio materials. They will also engage with news, articles, and books to enhance their reading skills.
5th Semester	Level4A	3 Months	Recap of Level 3B, Professional Grammar, Writing, Reading, Speaking, Listening to News, and Building Job Skills. Understanding Google Drive, Cloud Storage, Technology, and Email Communication for success.	Level 4 offers great exercises and examples to introduce English at an advanced stage, including key language skills, grammar, and vocabulary. It builds students' confidence and fluency in conversational English. By the end of this semester, students will be able to write long paragraphs, discuss any topic, and have memorized sufficient vocabulary for professional use. This course is ideal for those looking for more professional jobs.
	Level4B	3 Months	Recap of Level 4A, Professional writing, reading, and listening related to work, life, health, and personal development (e.g., Understanding the Job Application Process, Hiring Process information, Career Development resources, Building a Network, Social Media, and Job Referrals).	This level prepares students for professional environments by focusing on advanced writing, reading, and listening skills. It covers practical information related to job applications and career development, helping students build a professional network.
6th Semester	Level5A	3 Months	Recap of Level 4B, Presenting in Class for 10 Minutes on Any Topic, Writing 10 Sentences with No Errors. The resources in this section will support students as they master subject-specific academic vocabulary used in their core subjects.	To fully understand how to speak English effectively, students must move beyond fundamental grammar and tackle more sophisticated sentence constructions. This level focuses on advanced-level topics to help create complex, meaningful sentences and communicate more naturally. By the end of this semester, students will be fully prepared to fluently communicate, write professional emails, and letters. This course is ideal for professionals looking to enroll in colleges or universities to obtain a degree.
	Level5B	3 Months	Recap of Level 5A, Advanced Writing Skills, Advanced Grammar, College Preparation, Public Speaking Skills, College Research, Subject Selection, TOEFL Preparation, and Degree Evaluation Resources.	The final level focuses on perfecting advanced writing and speaking skills, preparing for college or university entrance exams like TOEFL, and mastering subject-specific vocabulary. Students will be ready for academic and professional challenges.
